



Three Downtown Street Corners Renamed For Court Officers

Three Downtown Manhattan street corners were renamed for three state court officers who died on September 11th.

About 1,000 people were on hand to honor Captain William Thompson and Officers Thomas Jurgens and Mitchell Wallace Saturday.

"I am forever grateful for the support that my family have received over the last five years, and I am truly honored to be here today on behalf of my father," said Michael Thompson, whose father was killed on 9/11.

"It's really cool to that there is a whole street in New York City named after my uncle," said Logan Miller.

"Just to be able to walk the streets and see his name up front with the courts, it is just mind boggling that everyone showed up today for the three court officers and that they are finally able to get this recognition that they so richly deserve," said Michelle Miller, whose brother was killed on 9/11.

Some 30 state court officers, who have their headquarters just two blocks from the World Trade Center site, were among the first to respond to the scene on 9/11.
